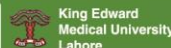

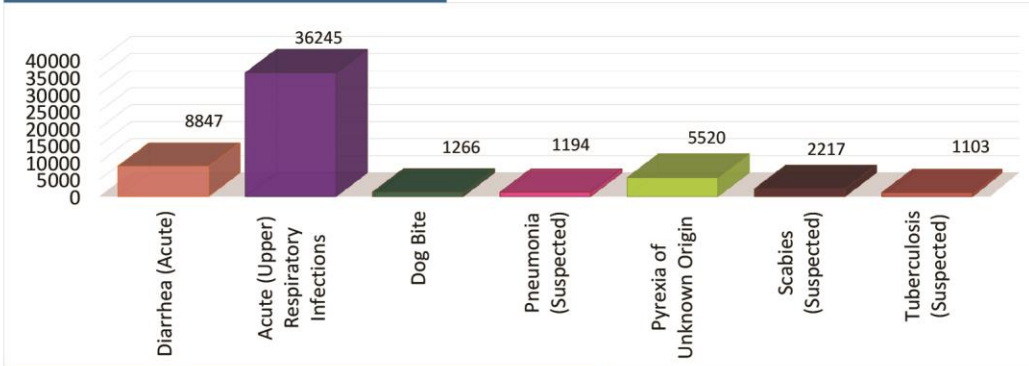

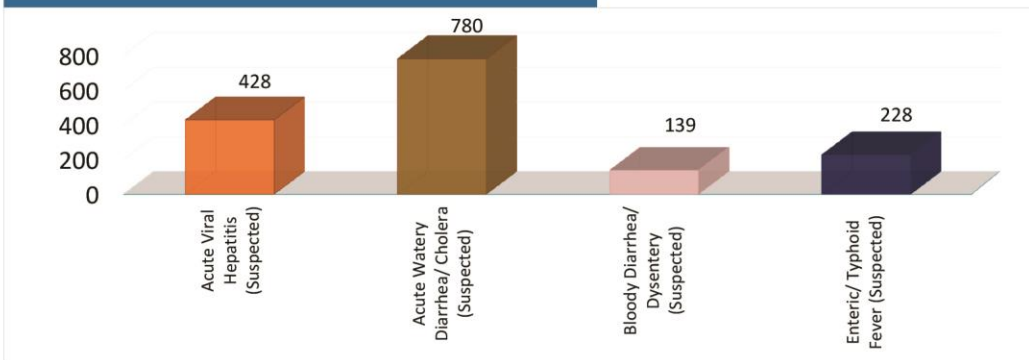

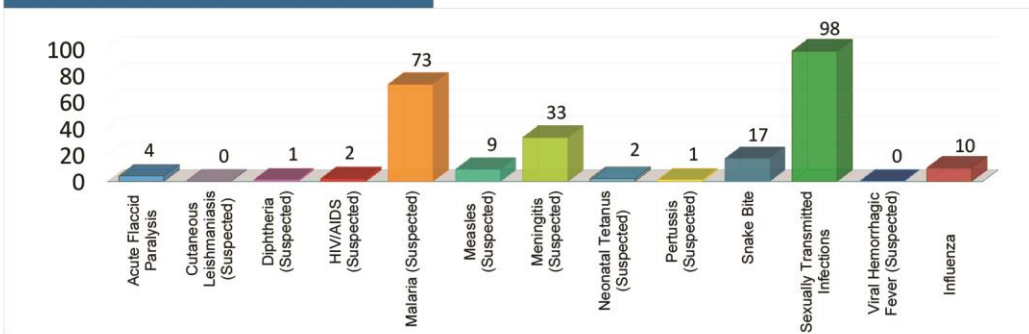
Diseases with number of cases >1000

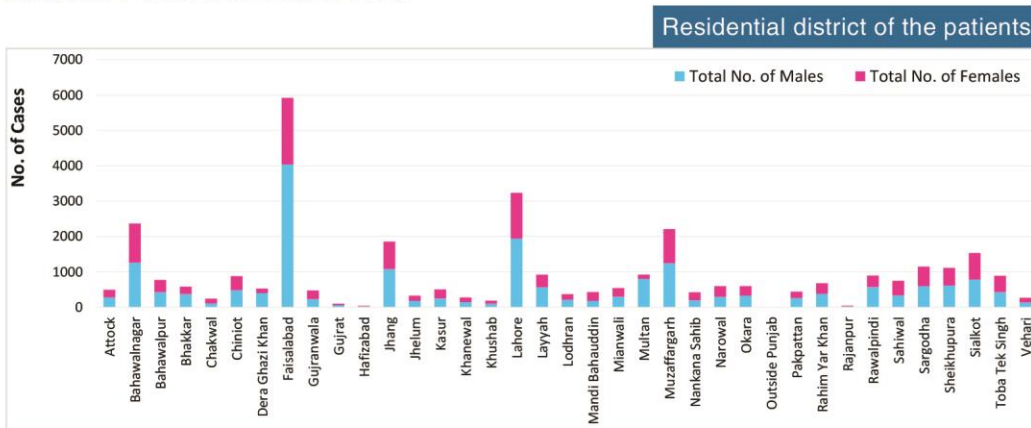
CASE DEFINITION

Unexplained Fever: Fever (body temperature >38.5 °C (101.3°F)) for >48 hours and without other known etiology
Pyrexia of Unknown Origin: A patient having fever of > 38.5°C (101.3°F) for more than 3 weeks with no established diagnosis despite appropriate.”

WEEK WISE DISTRIBUTION



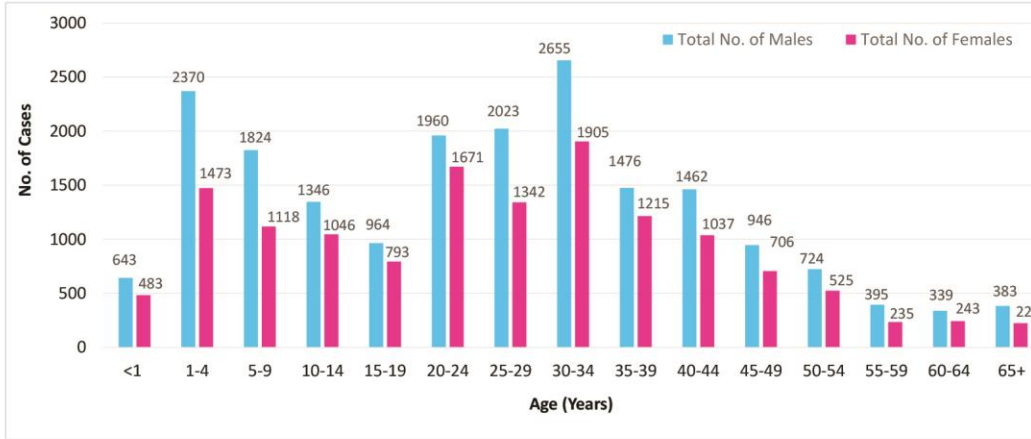
DISTRICT WISE DISTRIBUTION



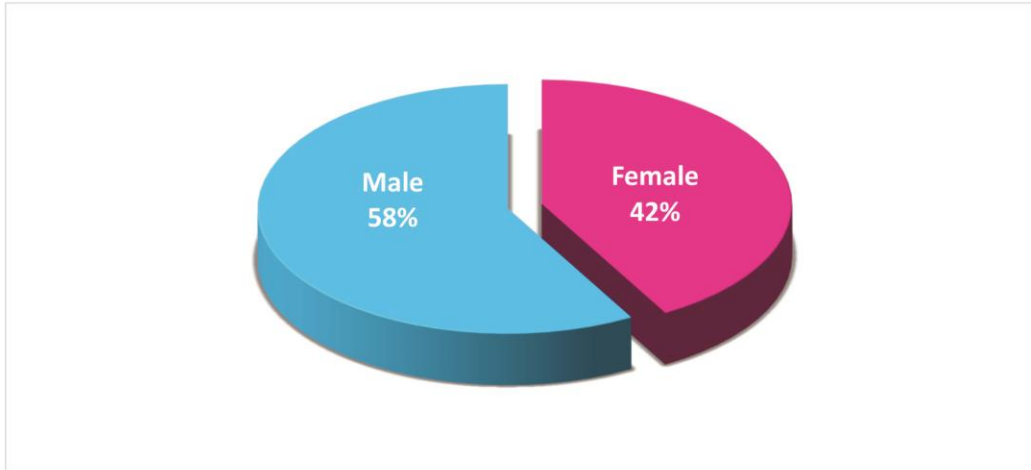

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AGE WISE DISTRIBUTION



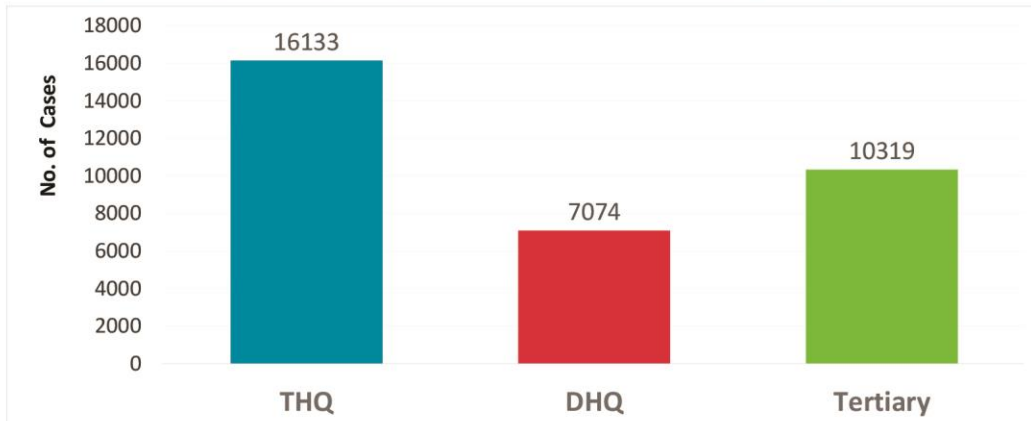
GENDER WISE DISTRIBUTION

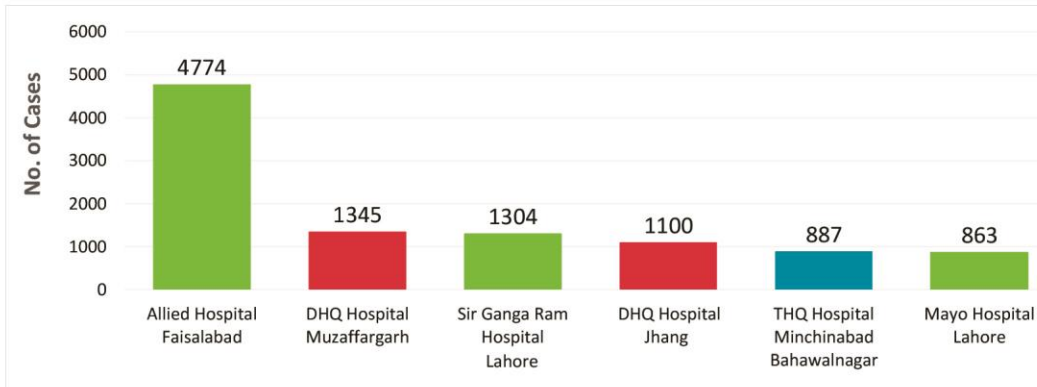

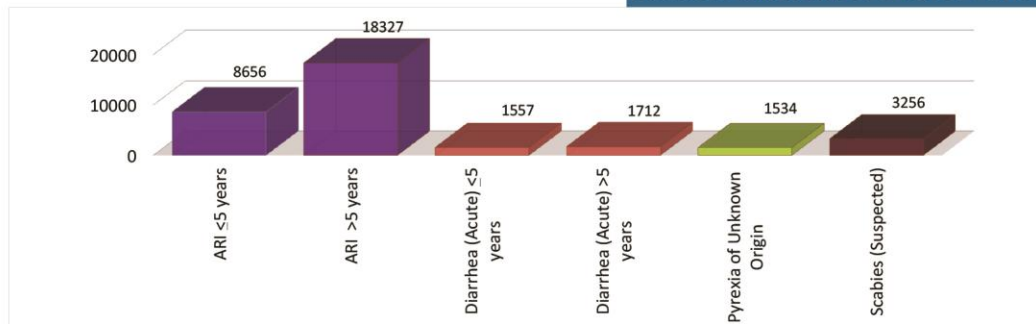

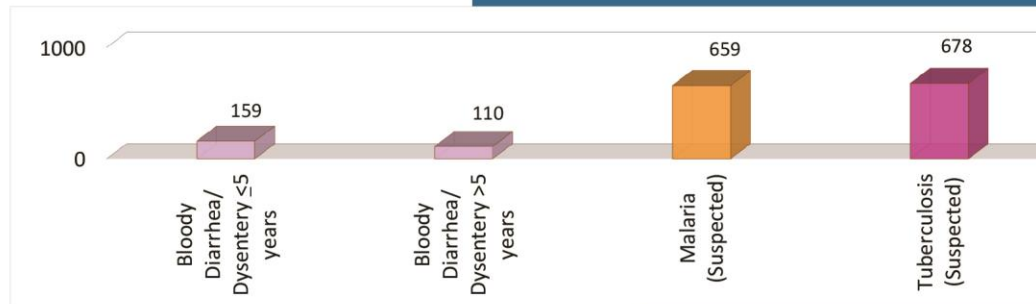


DISEASE WISE DISTRIBUTION

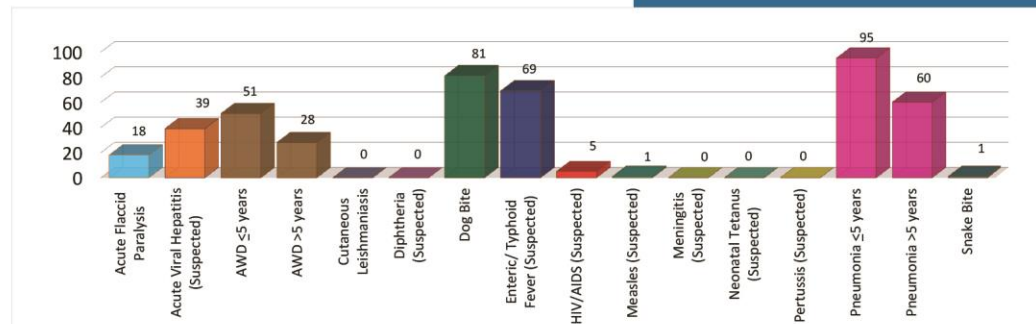
Diseases with number of cases >1000

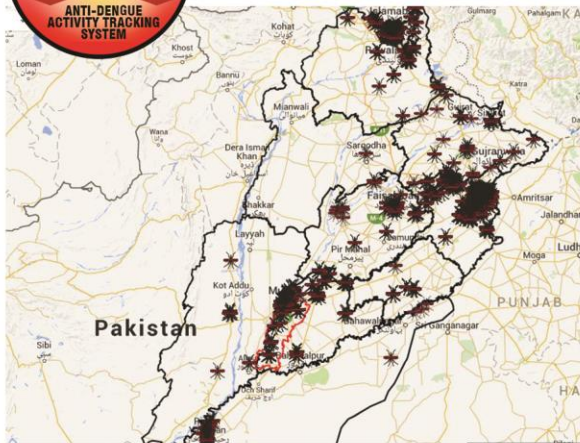

Focusing Dengue

Smart phone based dengue surveillance continues in **week 6, 2016**. Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Chakwal, Gujranwala, Kasur, Hafizabad, Sialkot, Sargodha, Mianwali, Sahiwal, Okara, Multan, DG Khan, Muzaffargarh, Bahawalpur, Rajanpur and Rahim Yar Khan have carried out anti-dengue activities as per SOPs of Government.

Altogether **80039** activities have been performed in **week 6, 2016**.
