Applicability of Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014

This Bidding Process will be governed under Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014, as amended from time to time and instructions of the Government of the Punjab received during the completion of the project.

1. Invitation to Bid

1.1 PPRA Rules to be followed

Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014 will be strictly followed. These may be obtained from PPRA's website.

In this document, unless otherwise mentioned to the contrary, "Rule" means a Rule under the Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014.

1.2 Mode of Advertisement(s)

As per Rule 12(1&2), this Tender is being placed online at PPRA's website, as well as being advertised in print media.

As per Rule 12(2), this Tender is also placed online at the website of Purchaser. The tender document is available in the office of Punjab Information Technology Board, 13th Floor, Arfa Software Technology Park, 346-B, Ferozpur Road, Lahore & the same may be obtained subject to the payment of cost of printing and provision of the document which is Rs. 1000/-. Tender Document is also available at www.pitb.gov.pk and www.ppra.punjab.gov.pk and may be downloaded free of cost.

All prospective bidders are required to collect a Challan Form from the Procurement Assistant, PITB at above given address; to submit an amount of Rs. 1,000/- in PITB's account. The deposit slip / Challan Form must accompany respective bid.

1.3 Type of Open Competitive Bidding

As per Rule 38(2) (a), Single Stage - Two Envelope Bidding Procedure shall be followed. The said procedure is reproduced as follows:

- (i) the bid shall be a single package consisting of two separate envelopes, containing separately the financial and the technical proposals;
- (ii) the envelopes shall be marked as "Financial Proposal" and "Technical Proposal";
- (iii) in the first instance, the "Technical Proposal" shall be opened and the envelope marked as "Financial Proposal" shall be retained unopened in the custody of the procuring agency;
- (iv) the procuring agency shall evaluate the technical proposal in the manner prescribed in advance, without reference to the price and shall reject any proposal which does not conform to the specified requirements;
- (v) during the technical evaluation no amendments in the technical proposal shall be permitted;
- (vi) after the evaluation and approval of the technical proposals, the procuring agency shall open the financial proposals of the technically accepted bids, publically at the time, date and venue announced and communicated to the bidders in advance, within the bid validity period;
- (vii) the financial bids found technically nonresponsive shall be returned un-opened to the respective bidders; and
- (viii) the lowest evaluated bidder shall be awarded the contract.

2. Bidding Details (Instructions to Bidders)

All bids must be accompanied by Bid Security (Earnest Money) as part of Financial bid and as per provisions of the clause "Bid Security" of this document in favor of "**Punjab Information Technology Board**". The complete bids as per required under this tender document must be delivered into the Tender Box No.1, placed at reception of Punjab Information Technology Board, not later than 1500 hours on last date of submission of bids i.e. **10th October, 2017**, late bids shall not be considered. The Technical bids shall be publicly opened in the Committee Room of Punjab Information Technology Board, 13th Floor, Arfa Software Technology Park, 346-B, Ferozpur Road, Lahore, at 1530 hours on, **10th October, 2017**. In case the last date of bid submission falls in / within the official holidays / weekends of the Purchaser, the last date for submission of the bids shall be the next working day.

Queries of the Bidders (if any) for seeking clarifications regarding the specifications of the services must be received in writing to the Purchaser till **01st October, 2017**. Any query received after said date may not be entertained. All queries shall be responded to within due time. PITB will host a Pre-bid session at PITB premises (13th Floor, Arfa Software Technology Park, 346-B, Ferozpur Road, Lahore). All Bidders shall be informed of the date and time advance.

The bidder shall submit bids which comply with the Bidding Document. Alternative bids shall not be considered. The attention of bidders is drawn to the provisions of this tender document Clause regarding "**Determination of Responsiveness of Bid**" and "**Rejection / Acceptance of the Tender**" for making their bids substantially responsive to the requirements of the Bidding Document.

It will be the responsibility of the Bidder that all factors have been investigated and considered while submitting the Bid and no claim whatsoever including those of financial adjustments to the contract awarded under this Bid Process will be entertained by the Purchaser. Neither any time schedule, nor financial adjustments arising thereof shall be permitted on account of failure by the Bidder.

It must be clearly understood that the Terms and Conditions and Specifications are intended to be strictly enforced. No escalation of cost except arising from increase in quantity by the Bidder on the demand and approval of the Purchaser will be permitted throughout the period of completion of the contract.

The Bidder should be fully and completely responsible for all the deliveries and deliverables to the Purchaser.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE TENDER

3. Definitions

In this document, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context:

- 3.2 “Authorized Representative” means any representative appointed, from time to time, by the Client, the Purchaser or the Contractor.
- 3.3 “Availability and Reliability” means the probability that a component shall be operationally ready to perform its function when called upon at any point in time.
- 3.4 “Client” means the Project lead of technical wing of the Purchaser for whose’ particular project the Goods/Services have been procured or any other person, duly appointed in writing, by the Client, for the time being or from time to time, to act as Client for the purposes of the Contract.
- 3.5 “Bidder/Tenderer” means the interested Firm/Company/Supplier/Distributors that may provide services to any of the public/private sector organization under the contract and have registered for the relevant business thereof.

6. Tender Scope:

6.1. Project Scope and Location.

Pakistan especially Punjab has been hit by vector-borne diseases in 2011 and the years to follow. In 2011, Lahore had witnessed the biggest epidemic of Dengue Fever in the world. According to safe estimation as published by Health Department, Government of Punjab more than half a million individuals were affected by Dengue.

Moreover for Dengue epidemic, our geographical boundary is often hit by flood which results in spreading water borne diseases such as typhoid fever, cholera and Hepatitis A. Within the last decade our nation has witnessed flood almost every other year. The project proposes deployment of Centralized System to monitor, control, eliminate and ultimately eradicate communicable & epidemic-prone diseases.

Said Health Reporting System captures critical datasets from hospital beyond disease cases.

- Patient Registration
- Patient Consultation
- Patient Demographics
- Details of Procedures Performed

Aforementioned data enables Health Department to carry out analytics including but not limited to following:

- Representation on GIS Maps
- Timely Escalation and Intimations
- Historical Data of Patients
- District/Tehsil and UC wise Disease Trends

- Social Habits per District/Tehsil and UC
- Disease cluster alarms
- Citizen feedback Indices

The proposal suggests mechanism to ensure adaptability at nominated health facilities. Data Entry Operators equipped with laptop and connectivity will be stationed at tertiary care hospitals. Aforementioned arrangement is subject to change in case specified by Secretary Health and Chairman PITB.

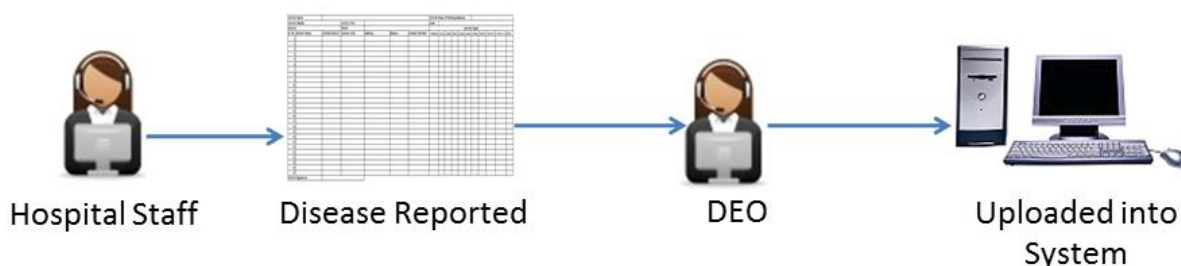
Background/History of Disease Surveillance System (DSS)

Disease Surveillance System has been operational throughout Punjab from April 2013 to December 2015 where data is being entered from 145 hospitals including Teaching Hospitals, DHQs and THQs on daily basis. The same data is fed into statistical engine which provides analytics based on residential addresses and type of disease in every district/tehsil.

Disease Reporting

Cluster 1

Disease Surveillance System defines that central data entry room has been occupied with Data Entry Operators as provided under the provision of its PC1.



Cluster 2

Disease surveillance activities from BHUs and RHCs are now reported via SMS using disease wheel. Notifiable/Communicable diseases as to be reported by RHCs and BHUs have been finalized in coordination with World Health Organisation (WHO and Health Department). Comma separated disease figures will be reported in same SMS for every disease as intimated to be reported.

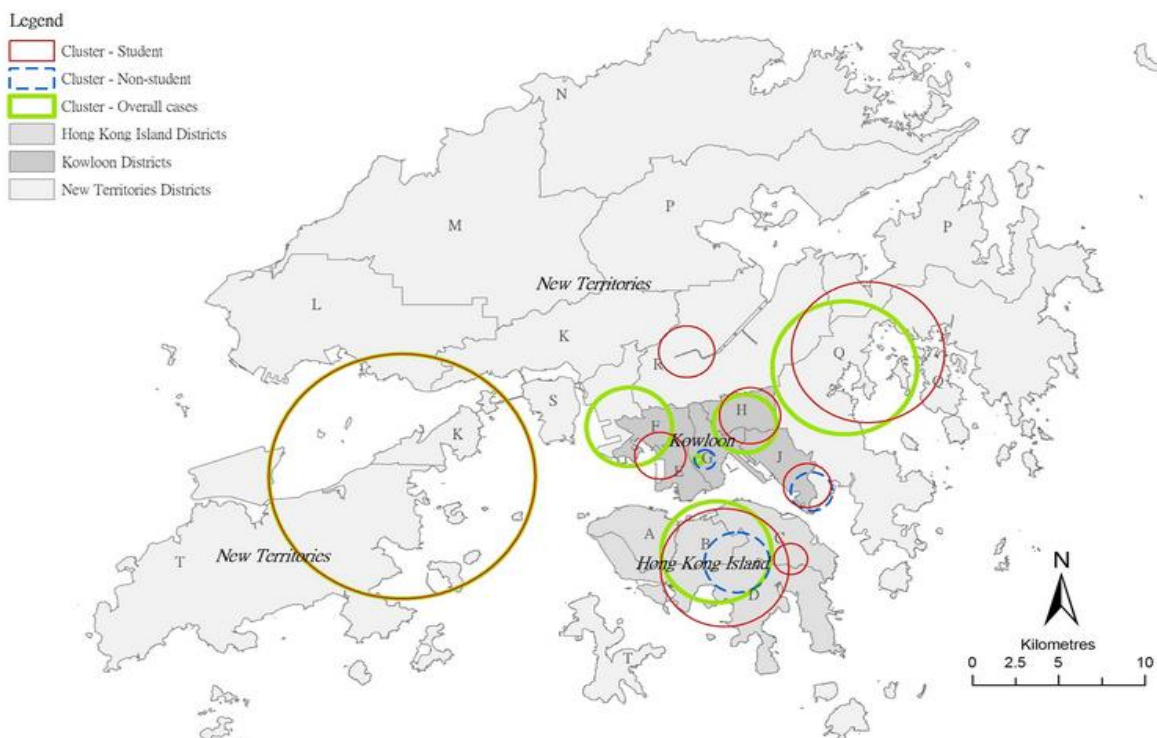


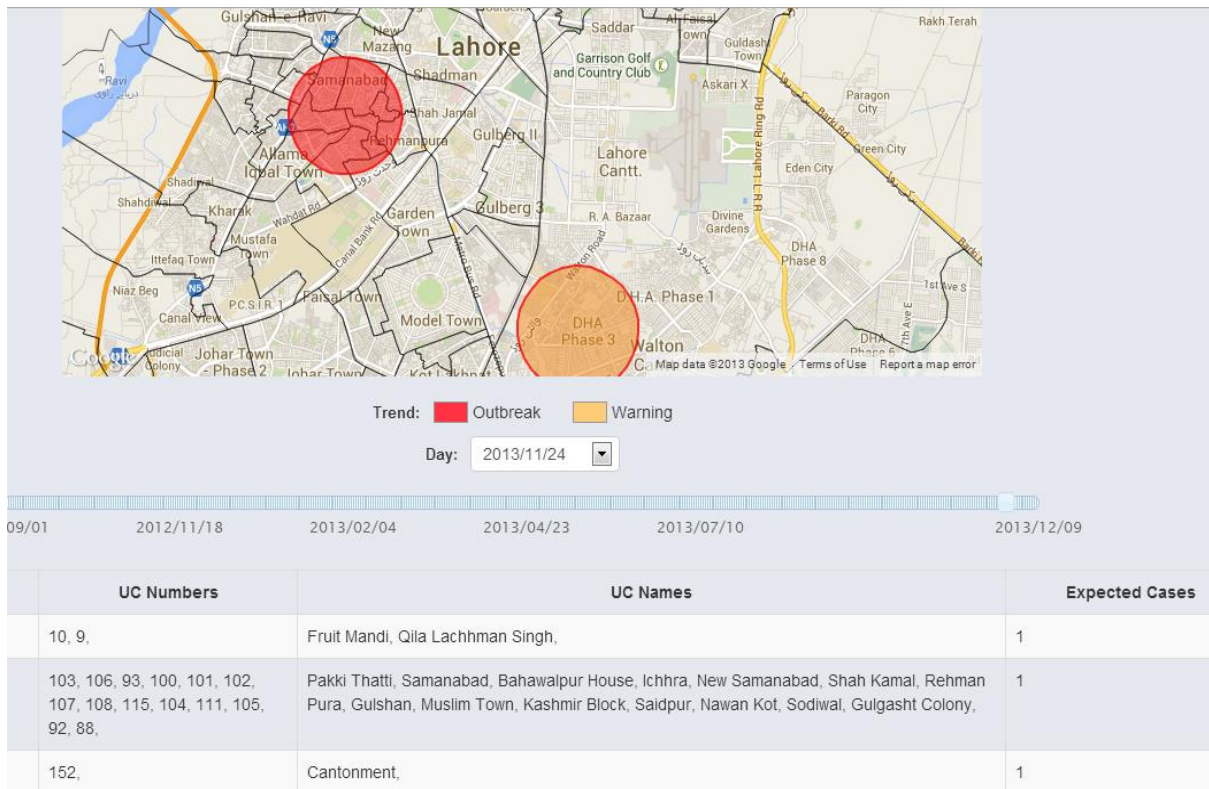
Disease Detection

The document uses of leading software to analyze spatial, temporal and space-time data using the spatial, temporal or space time scan statistics. The analysis is aimed to provide output in following areas:

- Geographical surveillance of disease
- Dispersion of disease over time, space or space and time
- Disease cluster alarms
- Time periodic disease surveillance for early detection of disease outbreaks

Following are sample images as taken from SatScan.





The said system also outlines the use of Early Aberration Reporting System (EARS) as used by Centre of Disease Control and Prevention in United States. The use of open source application will ensure emergency response and preparedness based on the statistical analysis of data as captured from the hospitals regarding disease outbreak.

The system targets to ensure preparedness of community, individuals, healthcare officials and Government of Punjab to prevent, quickly respond and recover against disease outbreak emergencies.

Disease Outbreak Alerts

The data in the system is based on historical trends suggest broadcasting of public awareness messages/robot calls to the citizens across Punjab. The system produces the list of citizens per defined filter to be used to communicate with citizens. SMS/Robot Calls are sent out to citizens in this regard which are funded by another project of PITB named Citizen Contact Center.

WHO has been engaged in coordination with Health Department for capacity building and support regarding appropriate case response and putting necessary control measures in place. Disease Investigation Unit has been setup by Local Government and Community Development Department. Health Department has also setup Disease Surveillance Cell which reviews progress pertaining to DSS on weekly basis and issue Disease Bulletin (DSS SITREP).

- **DSS vs HRS**

DSS will merge into HRS with all its features and functionality. Having said that, HRS is not a continuation or a logical extension of DSS as the Scope of Work is considerably changed. It will also capture critical data sets including Dengue, Patient Registration etc. as already mentioned in project objectives.

- **Relationship with other Projects in the same sector**

Health Reporting System (HRS) has implemented Parchi (Registration) system in government owned facilities and use this data to gather citizen feedback. The proposal

also suggests a mechanism to capture details in facility pertaining to procedures performed which are critical to output indicators as identified by Special Monitoring Unit (SMU) in CM Secretariat (letter attached).

- **Description and Justification of the Project:**

Healthcare facility penetration is facilitated via network of Teaching Hospitals, District Headquarters (DHQs), Tehsil Headquarters (THQs), Regional Health Centers (RHCs) and Basic Health Units (BHUs).

Primary health care facilities treat around 23,000 non-surgical emergencies every day. The department caters to health needs of a population of 92 million, which includes 2.5 million infants, 16 million children under 5 and over 3 million pregnant women. The project suggests capturing data related to diseases as reported throughout Punjab in Teaching Hospitals and DHQs.

Per Special Monitoring Unit (SMU) at Chief Minister Secretariat, Registration System (Parchi) and Monitoring of Output Indicators (data pertaining to procedures and deliveries) need to be gathered on a regular basis. Proposal envisions deployment of DEOs for the same purpose which would help consolidate data in a singular interface.

Successful implementation of the project depends upon continuous inspection of the facilities for which it has been envisaged. The committee comprising of members from Health Department, PITB and WHO would conduct visits on a regular basis. The said anticipation formulates the basis of demand of the vehicle in the document. These visits will target identification of any concerns pertaining to availability of data entry forms.

PITB runs various systems for Health Department including Medicine Inventory Equipment Control, Biometric Attendance System, eVaccination, Health Watch, HealthAbode, Polio Control Information System and many others. Centralized control room will be setup in Health Department displaying important parameters on video wall. The initiative is crucial for officials at Health Department to keep an eye on important parameters on the go. Largely officials at Punjab government i.e., Chief Secretary Office, DCOs and Commissioners are connected via Video Conferencing Solution, it is proposed that video conferencing solution may be installed at Health Department to help Secretary Health patch through to other officials from his office. This will help save valuable time of Secretary Health while having to travel to remote areas to attend sessions.

Health department strives hard to transform their network of facilities across Punjab along the modern lines and introduce patient centric interventions. It is therefore, envisioned that consultants in multiple areas would be engaged right throughout the gestation of project to help Health Department replicate best practices within the province. These consultation may vary from hygiene practices, IT interventions, waste management and others.

HRS Interfaces

Access to the data entry interface will be shared with government hospitals via secured usernames and passwords. Participating hospitals will be responsible under supervision of Health Department, Government of Punjab to report data into the following tentative format.

Data from BHUs and RHCs will be reported via SMS based system.

Alerts

The data into the system will be disseminated for public awareness using published (hardcopy) of weekly bulletins, messages and robot calls to the citizens across Punjab.

SMS/Robot Calls are sent out to citizens in this regard which are funded by another project of PITB named Citizen Contact Center.

Assumptions

150 DEOs will be required to run this project in smooth fashion. These DEOs are typically placed at Teaching Hospitals across Punjab (in shifts to capture data of patient registrations, procedures performed and consultations). Till date more than 12.05 million records have been entered into the system.

Rendering Service for Data Entry

The project outlines the requirement of Data Entry Operators to be supplied to hospitals (Teaching Hospitals, only) as per the requirements. DEOs will be equipped with laptops and Internet Dongle or any other means of internet connectivity. DEOs as stationed into designated Hospitals will be tasked to enter data into the system.

The document proposes outsourcing data entry activity to third party, provision of laptop and internet connectivity will be the responsibility of the same.

It may be decided to geo-tag the data of patients which will help PITB run geographical analysis on the data. Geo-Tagging can help executive users find a wide variety of location-specific information. The data under subject usually consists of latitude and longitude coordinates which will help in generating reports through EARS and SatScan. The process will carry out through outsourcing / hiring of skilled staff.

Trainings

Comprehensive trainings of Hospital staff and/or other individuals will be carried out to ensure adoption of system. In-house sessions, conference calls and off site discussion forums have been used as medium of imparting trainings. Statistical officers as located in EDO office of every district play critical role, thus will be engaged to review data on regular basis.

Implementation Strategy

HRS is going to be implemented in following health facilities. Any other private hospitals or laboratories may participate but are not included on need basis as determined by Secretary Health and/or Chairman PITB.

The project will be operational in 44 hospitals throughout Punjab where data will be entered from Teaching Hospitals on daily basis. Data Entry Operators are going to be deputed there to enter the patient's data. Health Department/PITB may decrease the number of data entry operators required but may not be able to increase requirement against the maximum cap as elaborated in PC-1. Health department may decide to employ data entry operators on their own payroll apart from outsourcing after expiry of gestation of the project.

HRS Goals:

To capture data pertaining to following focus areas:

- Patient Consultations
- Patient Registration
- Procedures Performed
- Data pertaining to Deliveries

Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB) along with Specialized Healthcare & Medical Education department and Punjab Public Health Agency will launch a program to assess, evaluate and monitor the performance of tertiary care hospitals and staff deputed at respective hospitals. This performance, evaluation and reward system at tertiary level will be implemented to improve the efficiency of service delivery, transparency and bring smart monitoring to increase the quality of service delivery to patient. The performance rewards for the top performer (institution and individual) will also encourage others to provide quality services to the patients in order to attain the reward.

- Contract will be of Ten (10) months initially from the date of LOA.
- The further extension of the project is based upon the mutual agreement of all parties and necessary budgetary approvals and the discretion of purchaser provided the satisfactory performance by the contract.

7. Tender Eligibility/Qualification Criteria

7.1 Eligible Bidder/Tenderer is a Bidder/Tenderer who:

20.1.8 In compliance with the Preparation/Submission of Tender in a manner prescribed in this tender document clause-13; (Preparation / Submission of Tender)

20.1.9 Conforms to all terms and conditions of the Tender Document, without material deviation or reservation.

- 20.2 A material deviation or reservation is one which affects the scope, quality or performance of the Goods / Services or limits the Purchaser's rights or the Tenderer's obligations under the Contract.
- 20.3 The Tender determined as not substantially responsive shall not subsequently be made responsive by the Tenderer by correction or withdrawal of the material deviation or reservation.

21. Correction of errors / Amendment of Tender

- 21.1 The Tender shall be checked for any arithmetic errors which shall be rectified, as follows:
- 21.1.1 if there is a discrepancy between the amount in figures and the amount in words for the Total Tender Price entered in the Tender Form, the amount which tallies with the Total Tender Price entered in the Price Schedule, shall govern.
- 21.1.2 if there is a discrepancy between the unit rate and the total price entered in the price Schedule, resulting from incorrect multiplication of the unit rate by the quantity, the unit rate as quoted shall govern and the total price shall be corrected, unless there is an obvious and gross misplacement of the decimal point in the unit rate, in which case the total price as quoted shall govern and the unit rate shall be corrected.
- 21.1.3 if there is a discrepancy in the actual sum of the itemized total prices and the total tender price quoted in the Price Schedule, the actual sum of the itemized total prices shall govern.
- 21.2 The Tender price as determined after arithmetic corrections shall be termed as the Corrected Total Tender Price which shall be binding upon the Tenderer.

22. TECHNICAL EVALUATION CRITERIA

PASS MARKS: A technically eligible bidder, based on conditions listed in this document, not meeting the 70% pass marks limit will be rejected in Technical Evaluation, and its sealed/unopened Financial Proposal shall be returned back. All bidders scoring greater than or equal to 70% of the marks will be accepted in technical proposal, and their financial bids will be opened.

PROVISO: Provided that if NONE or ONLY ONE (single) bidder exceeds the 70% pass mark, then the purchaser SHALL decrease the Pass Mark limit to 60%. In other words, if TWO or more bidders exceed 70%, then the Pass Mark will NOT be decreased to 60%.

If Pass Marks are decreased to 60%, then ALL bidders with scores greater than or equal to 60% shall be considered EQUALLY as approved in the Technical Evaluation, and their Financial Bids shall be opened.

23. FINANCIAL PROPOSAL EVALUATION

23.1 Technically qualified/successful bidder(s)/Tenderer(s) shall be called for opening of the Financial Proposal(s). The Financial Proposals will be opened in the presence of the Bidders at the time and venue indicated by the Purchaser accordingly. The technically Eligible/Successful Bidder(s)/Tenderer(s) or their authorized representatives shall be allowed to take part in the Financial Proposal(s) opening.

23.2 Financial Proposal evaluation will be conducted under the Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014. The Price evaluation will include all duties, taxes and expenses etc. In case of any exemption of duties and taxes made by the Government in favor of the Purchaser, the contractor shall be bound to adjust the same in the Financial Proposal.

23.2.1 In cases of discrepancy between the cost/price quoted in Words and in Figures, the lower of the two will be considered.

23.2.2 In evaluation of the price of an imported item, the price will be determined and considered inclusive of the customs and other import duties etc.;

24. Rejection / Acceptance of the Bid

24.1 The Purchaser shall have the right, at his exclusive discretion, to increase/ decrease the quantity of any or all item(s)/Services without any change in unit prices or other terms and conditions at the time of order placement. The Purchaser may reject all bids or proposals at any time prior to the acceptance of a bid or proposal. The Purchaser shall upon request, communicate to any bidder, the grounds for its rejection of all bids or proposals, but shall not be required to justify those grounds. 24.2.4 bid not submitted and relevant bid security is not submitted; or

24.2.5 subjected to interlineations / cuttings / corrections / erasures / overwriting; or

24.2.6 the Tenderer refuses to accept the corrected Total Tender Price; or

24.2.7 the Tenderer has conflict of interest with the Purchaser; or

24.2.8 the Tenderer tries to influence the Tender evaluation / Contract award; or

24.2.9 the Tenderer engages in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the Contract award;

24.2.10 the Tenderer fails to meet all the requirements of Tender Eligibility / Qualification Criteria (Clause-7);

24.2.11 the Tenderer fails to meet the evaluation criteria requirements (clause-22);

24.2.12 the tenderer has been blacklisted by any public or private sector organization;

24.2.13 the Tenderer has been served any legal notices or displeasure letters by any public sector organization on serious failures to provide satisfactory services;

24.2.14 the Tenderer has mentioned any financial implication(s) in the financial proposal that is in contradiction to this document and Government rules and regulations.

24.2.15 there is any discrepancy between bidding documents and bidder's proposal i.e. any non-conformity or inconsistency or informality or irregularity in the submitted bid.

24.2.16 the Tenderer submits any financial conditions as part of its bid which are not in conformity with tender document.

24.2.17 Non-submission of verifiable proofs against the mandatory as well as general documentary, qualification and eligibility related requirements.

25. Award Criteria

25.1. At first step, eligible bidder(s)/tenderer(s) as per clause-7(Tender Eligibility) of this document fulfilling the qualification and technical evaluation criteria will stand technically qualified.

25.2. At second step, technically qualified and successful bidder(s)/tenderer(s) will be evaluated in the light of all Pre-Conditions, necessary requisites and shall be selected on lowest cost quoted as per rules and fulfilling all codal formalities, irrespective of their score in the previous step.

26. Acceptance Letter

As per provisions of Rule (55) of Punjab Procurement Rules 2014, the Purchaser shall issue the Acceptance Letter to the successful Tenderer, at least after 10 days of announcement of bid evaluation reports (Ref. Rule-37 of PPRA Rules, 2014) and prior to the expiry of the original validity period or extended validity period of the Tender, which shall constitute a contract, until execution of the formal Contract.

27. Performance Security

27.1 The successful Tenderer/The Contractor, shall furnish Performance Security as under:

27.1.1 within twenty (28) days of the receipt of the Acceptance Letter from the Purchaser;

27.1.2 Performance security (if the bidder is successful would be submitted by the Bidder;

27.1.3 in the form of a Bank Guarantee, issued by a scheduled bank operating in Pakistan, as per the format provided in the Tender Document;

27.1.4 for a sum equivalent to 10% of the contract value;

27.1.5 denominated in Pak Rupees;

27.1.6 have a minimum validity period until the date of expiry of warranty period, support period or termination of services, or fulfillment of all obligations under the contract, whichever is later. No other shape or form of performance security shall be acceptable with any validity less than the prescribed time period.

27.2 The Performance Security shall be payable to the Purchaser, on occurrence of any / all of the following conditions:

27.2.3 If the Contractor violates any of the terms and conditions of the Contract.

27.4 In case the Contractor fails to furnish Performance security in the shape of bank guarantee within the stipulated period given under Letter of Acceptance and subsequent formal contract, or till end of the currency of the said contract, the amount of bank guarantee, as required, shall be deducted from the amount payable to the Contractor.

28. Redressal of grievances by the procuring agency

28.1 The Purchaser has constituted a committee comprising of odd number of persons, with proper powers and authorizations, to address the complaints of bidders that may occur prior to the entry into force of the procurement contract.

28.2 Any bidder feeling aggrieved by any act of the Purchaser after the submission of his bid may lodge a written complaint concerning his grievances not later than ten days after the announcement of the bid evaluation report.

28.3 The committee shall investigate and decide upon the complaint within fifteen days of the receipt of the complaint.

28.4 Mere fact of lodging of a complaint shall not warrant suspension of the procurement process.

28.5 Any bidder not satisfied with the decision of the committee of the Purchaser may lodge an appeal in the relevant court of jurisdiction.

1. The Contractor hereby covenants with the Purchaser to provide the Services and to remedy defects / damage therein, at the time and in the manner, in conformity in all respects with the provisions of the Contract, in consideration of the payments to be made by the Purchaser to the Contractor.
2. The Purchaser hereby covenants with the Contractor to pay the Contractor, the Contract Price or such other sum as may become payable, at the times and in the manner, in conformity in all respects with the provisions of the Contract, in consideration of provision of the Services and remedying of defects / damage therein.
3. The following shall be deemed to form and be read and construct as part of this Contract:
 - a. The Tender Document

II. General Conditions of Draft Contract

29. Contract

The Purchaser shall, after receipt of the Performance Security from the successful Tenderer, send the Contract provided in the Tender Document, to the successful Tenderer. Within three working days of the receipt of such Contract, the Tenderer shall sign and date the Contract and return it to the Purchaser.

30. Contract Duration

The Contract duration is initially for ten (10) Months from the date of issuance of LOA. The further extension of the project is based upon the mutual agreement of all parties and needs, requirements, necessary budgetary approvals and the discretion of purchaser, satisfactory services and performance by the contractor.

31. Contract Documents and Information

The Contractor shall not, without the Purchaser's prior written consent, make use of the Contract, or any provision thereof, or any document(s), specifications, drawing(s), pattern(s), sample(s) or information furnished by or on behalf of the Purchaser in connection therewith, except for purposes of performing the Contract or disclose the same to any person other than a person employed by the Contractor in the performance of the Contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only as far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

32. Contract Language

The Contract and all documents relating to the Contract, exchanged between the Contractor and the Purchaser, shall be in English. The Contractor shall bear all costs of translation to English and all risks of the accuracy of such translation.

33. Standards

The Goods supplied and the Services provided under this Contract shall conform to the authoritative latest industry standards.

34. Commercial Availability

The Services supplied under this Contract shall be commercially available at the time of signing of the contract. Commercial availability means that such Services shall have been rendered / delivered under two separate contracts by service provider globally / locally.

35. Patent Right

The Contractor shall indemnify and hold the Purchaser harmless against all third party claims of infringement of patent, trademark or industrial design rights arising from use of the Goods / Service or any part thereof.

36. Execution Schedule

The Contractor shall submit an Execution Schedule, giving details of services rendered, as required under the Contract, the Contractor shall deploy resources within two (2) weeks from the issuance of Acceptance Letter.

37. Payment

37.1 The Contractor shall provide all necessary supporting documents along with invoice.

37.2 The Contractor shall submit an Application for Payment (Invoice), to the Purchaser. The Application for Payment shall: be accompanied by such invoices, receipts or other

documentary evidence as the Purchaser may require; state the amount claimed; and set forth in detail, in the order of the Price Schedule, particulars of the Services delivered, up to the date of the Application for Payment and subsequent to the period covered by the last preceding Payment, if any.

- 37.3 The Purchaser shall issue a Certificate of Payment, in the prescribed form, with a copy to the Contractor, verifying the amount due, within seven days of receipt of an Application for Payment. The Client may withhold a Certificate of Payment on account of defect(s) / short coming(s) in the services provided. The Client may make any correction or modification in a Certificate of Payment that properly be made in respect of any previous certificate.
- 37.4 The Purchaser shall pay the amount verified within thirty (30) days. Payment shall not be made in advance. The Purchaser shall make payment for the Services provided to the Contractor, as per Government policy, in Pak Rupees, through treasury cheque.
- 37.5 The Contractor shall cause the validity period of the performance security to be extended for such period(s) as the contract performance may be extended. In case the Contractor fails to submit bank guarantee with extended validity period for such period(s) as the contract performance may be extended, an amount equal to 10% of total contract value shall be deducted from the payments to be made against the contract.
- 37.6 All payments shall be subject to any and all taxes, duties and levies applicable under the laws of Pakistan for the whole period starting from issuance of Acceptance Letter i.e. Letter of Acceptance (LOA) till completion of the signed contract in this regard.
- 37.7 Payments shall be made against successful delivery of services at end of each month.
- 37.8 The contractor shall submit attendance certificate to the purchaser of each DEO duly stamp and signed by designated person of the relevant health facility for the purpose payment and other documentary evidence as the Purchaser may require.

38. Price

The Contractor shall not charge prices for the Goods supplied, the Services provided and for other obligations discharged, under the Contract, varying from the prices quoted by the Contractor in the Price Schedule.

39. Contract Amendment

- 39.1 The Purchaser may at any time, by written notice served to the Contractor, alter or amend the contract for any identified need/requirement in the light of prevailing rules and regulations.
- 39.2 The Contractor shall not execute any change until and unless the Purchaser has allowed the said change, by written order served on the Contractor.
- 39.3 The change, mutually agreed upon, shall constitute part of the obligations under this contract, and the provisions of the Contract shall apply to the said change.
- 39.4 No variation in or modification in the contract shall be made, except by written amendment signed by both the Purchaser and the Contractor.

40. Assignment / Subcontract

- 40.1 The Contractor shall not assign or sub-contract its obligations under the Contract, in whole or in part, except with the Purchaser's prior written consent.
- 40.2 The Contractor shall guarantee that any and all assignees / subcontractors of the Contractor shall, for performance of any part / whole of the work under the contract, comply fully with the terms and conditions of the Contract applicable to such part / whole of the work under the contract.

41. Extensions in time for performance of obligations under the Contract

If the Contractor encounters conditions impeding timely performance of any of the obligations, under the Contract, at any time, the Contractor shall, by written notice served on the Purchaser, promptly indicate the facts of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of such notice, the Purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may, at its exclusive discretion, without prejudice to any other remedy it may have, by written order served on the Contractor, extend the Contractor's time for performance of its obligations under the Contract.

42. Liquidated Damages

If the Contractor fails / delays in performance of any of the obligations / service provisioning, under the contract / violates any of the provisions of the Contract / commits breach of any other right of action / remedy it may have, deduct from the Contract Price, as liquidated damages, a sum of money @10% of daily amount of the quoted cost of a resource (Data Entry Operator), will be charged per day per resource.

43. Blacklisting

If the Contractor fails / delays in performance of any of the obligations, under the Contract / violates any of the provisions of the Contract / commits breach of any of the terms and conditions of the Contract or found to have engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the award of contract or during the execution of the contract, the Purchaser may without prejudice to any other right of action / remedy it may have, blacklist the Contractor, either indefinitely or for a stated period, for future tenders in public sector, as per provision of Punjab Procurement Rules, 2014 and PITB Procurement Regulations and Guidelines.

44. Forfeiture of Performance Security

44.1 The Performance Security shall be forfeited by the Purchaser, on occurrence of any / all of the following conditions:

44.1.1 If the Contractor commits a default under the Contract;

44.1.2 If the Contractor fails to fulfill any of the obligations under the Contract;

44.1.3 If the Contractor violates any of the terms and conditions of the Contract.

44.1.4 The Contractor shall cause the validity period of the performance security to be extended for such period(s) as the contract performance may be extended. In case the Contractor fails to submit bank guarantee with extended validity period for such period(s) as the contract performance may be extended, an amount equal to 10% of total contract value shall be deducted from the payments to be made against the contract.

44.2 If the Contractor fails / delays in performance of any of the obligations, under the Contract / violates any of the provisions of the Contract / commits breach of any of the terms and conditions of the Contract the Purchaser may, without prejudice to any other right of action / remedy it may have, forfeit Performance Security of the Contractor.

44.3 Failure to supply required items/services within the specified time period will invoke penalty as specified in this document. In addition to that, Performance Security amount will be forfeited and the company will not be allowed to participate in future tenders as well.

45. Termination for Default

45.1 If the Contractor fails / delays in performance of any of the obligations, under the Contract / violates any of the provisions of the Contract / commits breach of any of the terms and conditions of the Contract the Purchaser may, at any time, without prejudice to any other right of action / remedy it may have, by written notice served on the Contractor, indicate the nature of the default(s) and terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, without any compensation to the Contractor. Provided that the termination of the Contract shall be resorted to only if the Contractor does not cure its failure / delay, within fifteen working days (or such longer period as the Purchaser may allow in writing), after receipt of such notice.

45.2 If the Purchaser terminates the Contract for default, in whole or in part, the Purchaser may procure, upon such terms and conditions and in such manner as it deems appropriate, Services / Works, similar to those undelivered, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Purchaser for any excess costs for such similar Services / Works. However, the Contractor shall continue performance of the Contract to the extent not terminated.

46. Termination for Insolvency

If the Contractor becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent, the Purchaser may, at any time, without prejudice to any other right of action / remedy it may have, by written notice served on the Contractor, indicate the nature of the insolvency and terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, without any compensation to the Contractor.

47. Termination for Convenience

47.1 Any of the parties may, at any time, by written notice served on the other party with a copy to the Client, terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, for its convenience, without any compensation to the other party.

47.2 The Services which are complete or to be completed by the Contractor, within thirty working days after the receipt of such notice, shall be accepted by the Purchaser. For the remaining Services, the Purchaser may elect:

47.2.1 to have any portion thereof completed and delivered; and/or

47.2.2 to cancel the remainder and pay to the Contractor an agreed amount for partially completed Services, Works and materials / parts previously procured by the Contractor for the purpose of the Contract, together with a reasonable allowance for overhead & profit.

48. Force Majeure

48.2 For the purpose of this contract "Force Majeure" means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of a party and which makes a party's performance of its obligations under the Contract impossible or so impractical as to be considered impossible under the circumstances, and includes, but is not limited to, War, Riots, Storm, Flood or other industrial actions (except where such strikes, lockouts or other industrial are within the power of the party invoking Force Majeure), confiscation or any other action by Government agencies. In all disputes between the parties as to matters arising pursuant to this Contract, the dispute be referred for resolution by arbitration under the Pakistan Arbitration Act, 1940, as amended, by one or more arbitrators selected in accordance with said Law. The place for arbitration shall be Lahore, Pakistan. The award shall be final and binding on the parties.

48.3 The Contractor shall not be liable for liquidated damages, forfeiture of its Performance Security, blacklisting for future tenders, termination for default, if and to the extent his failure / delay in performance / discharge of obligations under the Contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure.

48.4 If a Force Majeure situation arises, The Contractor shall, by written notice served on The Purchaser, indicate such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by The Purchaser in writing, The Contractor shall continue to perform under the Contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event.

48.5 Force Majeure shall not include (i) any event which is caused by the negligence or intentional action of a Party or Agents or Employees, nor (ii) any event which a diligent Party could reasonably have been expected to both (A) take into account at the time of the conclusion of this Contract and (B) avoid or overcome in the carrying out of its obligations here under.

48.6 Force Majeure shall not include insufficiency of funds or failure to make any payment required hereunder.

49. Dispute Resolution

49.2 The Purchaser and the Contractor shall make every effort to amicably resolve, by direct informal negotiation, any disagreement or dispute arising between them under or in connection with the Contract.

49.3 If, after thirty working days, from the commencement of such informal negotiations, the Purchaser and the Contractor have been unable to amicably resolve a Contract dispute, either party may, require that the dispute be referred for resolution by arbitration under the Pakistan Arbitration Act, 1940, as amended, by one or more arbitrators selected in accordance with said Law. The place for arbitration shall be Lahore, Pakistan. The award shall be final and binding on the parties.

50. Statutes and Regulations

- 50.2 The Contract shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of Pakistan.
- 50.3 The Contractor shall, in all matters arising in the performance of the Contract, conform, in all respects, with the provisions of all Central, Provincial and Local Laws, Statutes, Regulations and By-Laws in force in Pakistan, and shall give all notices and pay all fees required to be given or paid and shall keep the Purchaser indemnified against all penalties and liability of any kind for breach of any of the same.
- 50.4 The Courts at Lahore shall have the exclusive territorial jurisdiction in respect of any dispute or difference of any kind arising out of or in connection with the Contract.

51. Taxes and Duties

The Contractor shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties and other such levies imposed make inquiries on income tax / sales tax to the concerned authorities of Income Tax and Sales Tax Department, Government of Pakistan applicable at time of contract.

52. Contract Cost

The Contractor shall bear all costs / expenses associated with the preparation of the Contract and the Purchaser shall in no case be responsible / liable for those costs / expenses. The successful bidder shall provide legal stamp papers of relevant value according to Govt. rules and regulations for signing of the formal contract.

53. The Client

- 53.1 The Client shall only carry out such duties and exercise such authority as specified in the Contract. The Client shall have no authority to relieve the Contractor of any of his obligations under the Contract, except as expressly stated in the Contract.
- 53.2 The Contractor shall proceed with the decisions, instructions or approvals given by the Client in accordance with these Conditions.
- 53.3 The Client shall conform to all the relevant clauses of this Tender Document to carry out all responsibilities assigned thereto in a timely manner

54. Authorized Representative

- 54.1 The Purchaser, the Client or the Contractor may, at their exclusive discretion, appoint their Authorized Representative and may, from time to time, delegate any / all of the duties / authority, vested in them, to their authorized Representative(s), including but not limited to, signing on their behalf to legally bind them, and may, at any time, revoke such delegation.
- 54.2 The Authorized Representative shall only carry out such duties and exercise such authority as may be delegated to him, by the Purchaser, the Client or the Contractor.
- 54.3 Any such delegation or revocation shall be in writing and shall not take effect until notified to the other parties to the Contract.
- 54.4 Any decision, instruction or approval given by the Authorized Representative, in accordance with such delegation, shall have the same effect as though it had been given by the Principal.
- 54.5 If the Contractor questions any decision or instruction of the Authorized Representative of the Purchaser, the Contractor may refer the matter to the Purchaser who shall confirm, reverse or vary such decision or instruction.

55. Waiver

Failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of the obligations of the other party, under the Contract, shall in no way be deemed or construed to affect in any way the right of that party to require such performance.

56. Training

- 56.1 The Contractor shall arrange and undertake a comprehensive training program for the staff nominated by the Purchaser / the Client to ensure that they shall acquire a good working knowledge of supply of such Services to be supplied under the Contract.
- 56.2 In case of non-compliance with instructions, non-cooperation or other difficulties experienced by the Contractor with regard to any of these personnel, the Contractor shall apprise the Purchaser / Client and proceed to implement suitable remedial measures after consultation with them.

57. Documentation

The Contractor shall furnish the user documentation, the operation manuals, and service manuals for each appropriate unit of the supplied Goods and other information pertaining to the performance of the Goods, in hard copy format, in soft copy format and in the form of online help, before the Goods are taken over by the Purchaser.

58. Special Stipulations
